

Introduction

An Adventure of the American Mind (AAM) project is designed to train in-service and pre-service classroom teachers and college teacher education faculty to access, use and produce curriculum utilizing the Internet and the digitized primary source materials from the collections of the [Library of Congress](#).

The objectives for this multi-year program are to:

1. Demonstrate a Library of Congress American Memory Fellows Program pilot that teaches educators how to utilize technology and primary resources in their classroom instruction.
2. Train in-service and pre-service teachers to use primary resources in their classroom instruction.
3. Further validate the American Memory Program with a broad group of teachers in local settings (K-12).
4. Demonstrate and evaluate a training program that can be exportable to other communities at minimal cost.
